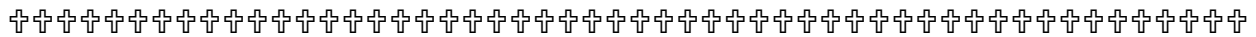

Not long ago I asked to write a little something about the ministry of Pilgrim Church and School. What follows is part of that article. May God bless us as we work together for his kingdom!

Pilgrim: We want you to see Jesus!

The “Pilgrim window” in our church building depicts the story of two pilgrims on their way from Jerusalem to Emmaus. Sad and confused because Jesus had died three days earlier, they didn’t recognize him when he joined their pilgrimage. The window captures the moment when these two pilgrims saw Jesus. The Bible verse at the bottom is printed to be read from outside the building: “Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him” (Luke 22:31) The window challenges us at Pilgrim: how many people in our neighborhood, wandering in confusion and sorrow, don’t realize just how close Jesus is and what he can do for them? The window invites people in the neighborhood to see Jesus as their Lord and Savior, their constant companion on the pilgrimage that leads us home to be with him.

Pilgrim School approaches inner city education with a suburban mentality. In other words, we use the use the same education and discipline methods that might be found in more “privileged” environments. We believe that by treating people with dignity and respect the inner city cycle of poverty and dysfunction can be broken. And above all, we believe that the true source of human worth and dignity is in a relationship with Jesus Christ. His gospel gives shape and direction to everything that we teach. The results of this approach speak for themselves: Over the past 15 years, the school has a 100% high school graduation rate. When the standard for high school graduation rates in Minneapolis is 33% for minority students and only slightly better for the collective, we know that we are making a difference.

A few quick facts about Pilgrim School:

- Diversity: 60% African American, 5% Asian, 2% Latino, 2% Native American, 31% Caucasian

- About 45% of the school population is at poverty levels of income or lower.
- Pilgrim charges the lowest tuition of any private, Christian school in Minneapolis. We also give away about \$40,000 in tuition assistance every year thanks to generous donations and support.
- Pilgrim School is currently funded by Pilgrim Church (33%), tuition (30%) and third source funding (37%)

This past year Pilgrim did not turn away a single family for financial reasons. We want to keep this precedent going, but without generous support from people who believe in our mission that will become increasingly difficult.

Pilgrim Church exists to meet the spiritual needs of an ethnically diverse community. In Revelation 22, God gave St. John a vision of the heavenly Jerusalem. In the midst of that great city is the Tree of Life. “And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations” (Revelation 22:2). We exist as a church to be a tree of life in the great city of Minneapolis. We believe that in the gospel of Jesus people can find hope and healing for their spiritual, personal and cultural conflicts. Through our food shelf, English as a Second Language offerings, community Bible studies, National Night Out, movie nights in the church, evangelism training, blood drives, community computer classes, and much more, we work to reach and help people in the name of Jesus Christ. We believe that the Lord who commands his people to “make disciples of all nations” has led the nations to our doorstep. We’re grateful and excited about the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead!

LET'S GO BIKING.

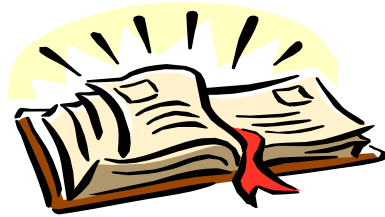

North American Outreach Emphasis Draws to a Close

UNDER THE BANNER "PROCLAIM PEACE THROUGH JESUS," WELS HAS BEEN EMPHASIZING NORTH AMERICAN OUTREACH FOR THE PAST FOUR YEARS. IN EACH OF THE THEMES—EVERY CHURCH A MISSION, EVERY SOUL A TREASURE, EVERY MEMBER A MISSIONARY, AND EVERY LIFE FOR CHRIST—"THE WORD EVERY IS REALLY IMPORTANT," SAYS FORMER WELS PRESIDENT KARL GURTEL. "IT REMINDS US OF THE INDIVIDUAL OPPORTUNITIES THAT WE ALL HAVE TO BE A WITNESS FOR CHRIST."

THE GOAL OF NORTH AMERICAN OUTREACH WAS TO EQUIP AND INVOLVE EVERY WELS CHURCH—AND EVERY MEMBER—IN OUTREACH. "MISSION WORK IS DONE NOT JUST BY HOME MISSIONS OR WORLD MISSIONS OR THE SYNOD. IT'S DONE BY EACH AND EVERY ONE OF US INDIVIDUALLY AND IN OUR CONGREGATIONS," SAYS BRUCE BECKER, ADMINISTRATOR OF WELS PARISH SERVICES AND NORTH AMERICAN OUTREACH COORDINATOR. "NORTH AMERICA IS A GROWING MISSION FIELD BECAUSE THE WORLD IS COMING TO US. AND THAT MISSION FIELD BEGINS RIGHT NEXT DOOR TO WHERE WE LIVE."

TO EQUIP AND PREPARE CONGREGATIONS FOR OUTREACH IN THEIR OWN COMMUNITIES, WORSHIP AND OUTREACH RESOURCES WERE PROVIDED FOR EACH PHASE. MATERIALS INCLUDED BIBLE STUDIES, VIDEOS, DEVOTIONS, AND WITNESSING TOOLS. "THE RESOURCES AND MATERIALS FROM EACH OF THE

FOUR YEARS WILL STILL BE AVAILABLE ONLINE FOR ANY CONGREGATION THAT WANTS TO UTILIZE THEM IN THE FUTURE,” SAYS BECKER.

ALTHOUGH CONGREGATIONAL PARTICIPATION IN THIS INITIATIVE SEEMED TO WANE IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, BECKER ENCOURAGES CHURCHES AND INDIVIDUALS TO CONTINUE REACHING OUT. “EVEN THOUGH THE FOUR-YEAR EMPHASIS OF NORTH AMERICAN OUTREACH IS OVER, IT STILL REMAINS A TOP PRIORITY IN OUR SYNOD TO PROCLAIM THE LIVING JESUS TO A DYING WORLD.”
