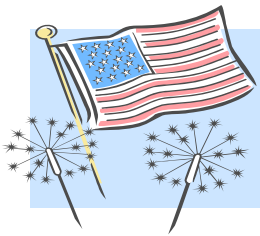

Freedom



This year once again we'll celebrate the Fourth of July with parades and hot dogs and fireworks. It's a great holiday. Of course, what makes it truly great is the idea behind it, an idea worth celebrating: freedom. We Americans love our freedom and through the years have shown that we are willing to defend it. We believe that freedom is the way that people should live.

Like all the good things that we embrace, the concept of freedom comes to us from God. The empty promises of sin may provide us with happiness for a time, but in the end they only enslave us. God saw the problem before we did and sent his Son to set us free. The notion that freedom comes at a high price also comes from God—the price paid for our freedom was the death of Jesus Christ on the cross. In him we are free. We have become heirs of the eternal life and live in that confidence every day.

Freedom can be abused. We know that as Americans, and we're angered when we hear of people who look at freedom as an excuse to take advantage of others or live irresponsibly.

Our freedom in Christ can be abused as well. He did not set us free from slavery to sin so that we could continue in sin. He did not set us free from hatred so that we can live in grudges against our brothers and sisters in the faith. He did not spare us from God's angry judgment so that we can sit in arrogant judgment of our neighbors. Some of our neighbors may not yet know the freedom that comes through faith in Jesus Christ. The gospel that has set us free has been given us so that we can offer to them the same comfort that we have, not so that we can consider ourselves "holier" than they.

Minneapolis is becoming one of the most ethnically diverse cities in North America, boasting the largest Hmong, Somali, Oromo and Tibetan populations on the continent. 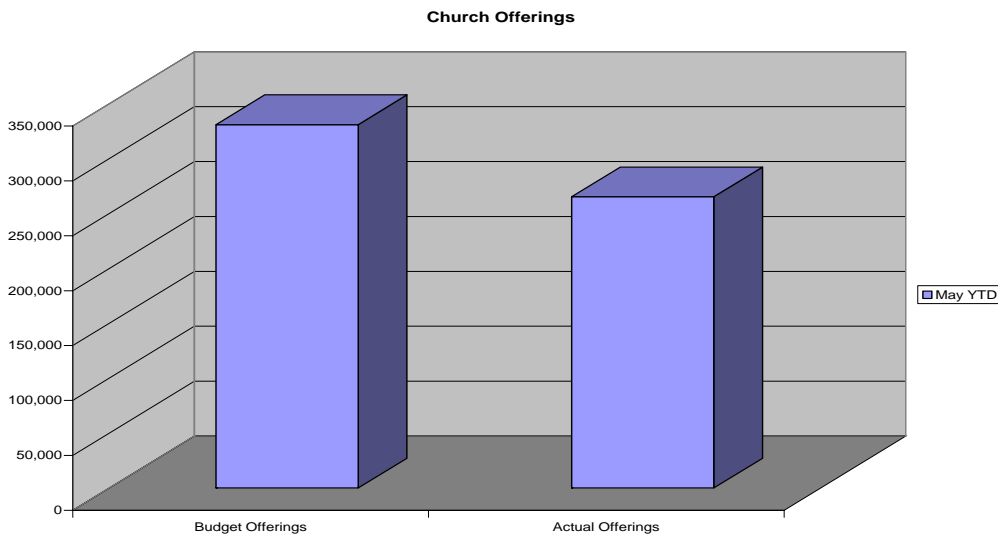

A Testimony to Christ by Tim Helmen

"This note was written by Tim on April 13th, 2006, before his cancer diagnosis:

I'm in the hospital with a fever and infection. Not nearly comfortable, but nowhere near excruciating pain. Everything seems to be under control: a few days of IV antibiotics at least, possibly a surgery. It doesn't seem that this should be life-threatening, but who can say?

If I should not survive this, I hope these words will speak for me after I have passed "up."

If that happens, know this: I am with my Lord, Jesus Christ. I am far from a perfect man. There is no need to list the full extent of my depravity, for words could not do it justice. But I place my full and complete confidence in Jesus of Nazareth. His suffering and death on the cross have paid the entire price for me and for you.

And this is important--do not miss this: He was dead and on the third day came back to life. This sealed the deal. He is exactly who he claimed to be--the Holy Son of God. My hope is only with Him and God has proclaimed His work for me more than sufficient. His resurrection was witnessed and attested to by people who **went to their deaths** proclaiming nothing else.

If you are reading this at my funeral, talk to the pastors. Talk to my beloved wife, Lori. Talk to my parents, who are an amazing gift of God to me and many others. Talk to my dear, dear children, Elaina Roxann and Caleb Andrew. What they have to say are not simply nice, positive thoughts. They are about eternity and history made theirs and made mine.

These words are for everyone--my family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, the Theatrix community and fellow musicians: I will live because Jesus lives. **The work is done.** And the work is done for **you** as well.

Jesus' love and forgiveness are for you, no matter what you've done, no matter where you've come from. He has won for you the very same hope with which I write these words; the very same hope I am enjoying in eternal reality as you read these words. Believe it. Trust it. Live in it. Die in it. And then I will see you a little later. I'll have some new songs I'd love to have you sing with me. **All glory to Jesus!**

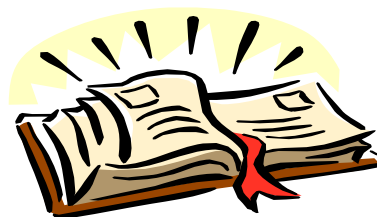

A Summer Recipe

Orange Chicken

3 shallots, finely chopped (who uses these things? I leave them out)
1 cup fresh orange juice
3 tablespoons lemon juice
2 tablespoons grated fresh ginger
2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
2 garlic cloves, minced
4 chicken breasts, skin removed or boneless – about 2 pounds

Mix all ingredients together and pour over chicken. Cover and marinate overnight or at least a couple of hours.

Bake in 350 oven for 35-40 minutes (if bone in chicken is used)

You can also grill - I made extra marinade and basted the chicken

Sauce:

½ cup orange juice

2 tablespoons lemon juice

½ cup beef or chicken stock

Combine in sauce pan and bring to boil. Reduce to about 1/3. pour over chicken and serve.
