I ask that men make no reference to my name and call themselves not Lutherans but Christians. What is Luther? After all, the doctrine is not mine, nor have I been crucified for anyone. St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 3 would not allow Christians to call themselves Pauline or Petrine, but Christian. How, then, should I, a poor evil smelling maggot sack have men give to the children of Christ my worthless name? No so, dear friends. Let us cast our party names and be called Christians after Him whose doctrine we have. The papists justly have a party name because they are not satisfied with the doctrine and name of Christ but want also to be popish. Let them be popish, then, since the pope is their master. Christ alone is our Master. He teaches me and all believers one and the same doctrine. (Matthew 23:8)

In late Fall 2006 the Healing House opened in Minneapolis. This non profit Christian organization provides help to women with addictions. The founders of Healing House understood from the beginning that when treating women with addictions they would also need to provide for children.

The feeling that we should help these families through our school was overwhelming. This year our school is providing education for two children from the program. We're blessed to have them and ask the congregation to pray for the success of our gospel ministry in their hearts.

Some quick facts about Healing House:

- Started in Fall 2006
- Program takes 12 to 18 months to complete
- Offers professional counseling and spiritual guidance
- The women and children that we minister to through the Healing House will also need a church home when their programs are complete. This may well mean more opportunities for Pilgrim to help, reach out, and grow.
- The Healing House hopes to become a national and international ministry

New WELS President

Rev. Mark Schroeder, 53, Wednesday accepted the call to be the next WELS president. Addressing the delegates to the 59th Biennial Convention at Martin Luther College in New Ulm, Minn. about the task ahead of him, Schroeder expressed the strength he gained from the book of Isaiah: "Surely it is God who saves me. I will trust in him and not be afraid."

Schroeder currently serves as president of Luther Preparatory School in Watertown, Wis. He has previously served at congregations in Fond du Lac, Wis., and Maitland, Fla.

Concluding his remarks, Schroeder told the delegates, "I will strive with the help of God to be faithful to the calling you have given me, and faithful to God's Word."

The meaning of Luther's seal

While Luther was a professor at Wittenberg, he devised a seal which was meant to be expressive of his theology. In a letter to a friend Luther explained the symbolism of his seal.

A black cross rests on a red heart "to put me in mind that faith in Christ crucified saves us.



"The heart rests on the center of a white rose "to show that faith causes joy, consolation and peace. The rose is white, not red, because white is the ideal color of all angels and blessed spirits."

The rose is fixed in a dark blue sky "to denote that such joy of faith in the spirit is but an earnest and beginning of heavenly joy to come, as anticipated and held by hope, though not yet revealed."

The sky is surrounded by a golden ring "to signify that such bliss in heaven is endless, and more precious than all joys and treasures..."

Christ, our dear Lord, He will give grace unto eternal life."

The annual Pilgrim Ladies Guild Make and Bake Sale is going public on **Saturday, October 27**.

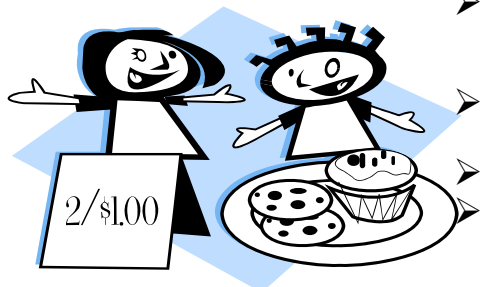
