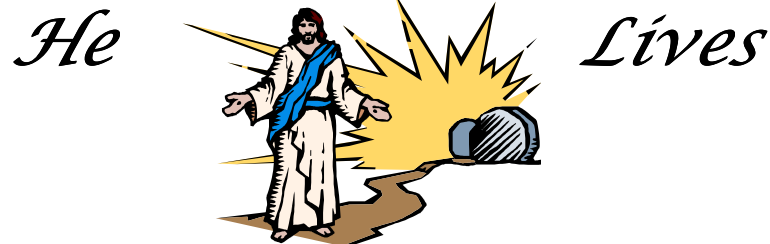

"I know that my Redeemer lives" are the words of a favorite Easter hymn. Recently, a popular song on Christian radio uses the same title. We love the words, and we love to sing them with confidence. But did you ever stop to think about where those words were first spoken?

The sentence comes from the Old Testament book of Job—chapter 19, verse 25 to be exact. In the first two chapters of the book, Job loses his family, wealth and health. He still has life and a wife, and she tells him to "curse God and die." Then his friends appear. One by one they tell him that he is suffering because he has sinned against God.

So there's Job: struck down for reasons he doesn't understand, surrounded by people who won't support him. And in all that, we hear this wonderful confession of Easter faith: "I know that my Redeemer lives." Job knew that the hardships he faced were only temporary, but that his Redeemer is forever.

Friends, our Redeemer lives! Health and wealth can come and go. Trials and temptations will always trouble us as long as we live. Even friends can let us down. But each day we can take comfort in a Savior who does not change. The sins that weigh us down have been forgiven. Our Savior paid for them with his own life, but even death itself could not keep our Redeemer down.

When hard times come our way, people may say, "Don't let it get you down." Often these are empty words with no power to comfort. The power of Easter isn't in nice sounding words. The power is in the person and

victorious resurrection of Jesus Christ. He lives! He has conquered death and hell, and we know that his victory is ours.

I know that my Redeemer lives,
 And that in the end he will stand upon the earth.
 And after my skin has been destroyed,
 yet in my flesh I will see God;
 I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another.
 How my heart yearns within me!

Dear faithful supporter of WELS,

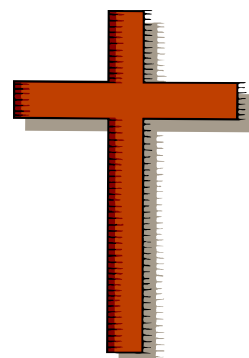

February 6, 2008

The February meeting began at 11:00 a.m. to allow enough time for the ladies to attend the Ash Wednesday service at 1:00 p.m. Twenty-two members and two visitors were in attendance. Thank you to the serving committee, Phyllis Martin and LaVonne Vrchota for the cheery valentine theme.

Pastor Leyrer introduced the three girls from Pilgrim who will be going on a mission trip to China in June, Hannah Bandelin, Olivia and Liana Leyrer. A total of nine students from St. Croix will visit high schools in China. We watched a DVD presentation that the mission team put together in their Broadcast/Journalism class at St. Croix. It will be used for fund raising appeals at various churches. The theme of the DVD was "Why Do You Want to Go To China?" The answer came back over and over – "to spread God's Word." There was discussion about a gift from Ladies Guild to support the mission trip. A motion was made, seconded and passed to give each girl \$100.

Margaret Johnson opened the meeting in President Doris Belsaas' absence. We sang "Happy Birthday" to Evelyn Cochran, Violet Lowry, Sarah and Rachel Homan. The Secretary's Minutes and Treasurer's Reports were approved as read. Many thank you notes for the Christmas gifts from the staff and various missions were passed around. One thank you note included an invitation from our organist, Arthur Wessels for Ladies Guild members (and congregation members) to sit in the balcony during the service to observe and enjoy the beautiful instrument as it is being played.

Committee reports followed. *The Catering Committee* would appreciate donations of bars for funeral luncheons from people other than Guild members. *Food Shelf* items will be needed in early March for stocking the Martin Luther College married students food shelf. *Altar flowers* will be placed on the altar on March 16 in honor of the Guild anniversary.

The meeting was adjourned in time for the ladies to attend the Ash Wednesday service.

85th Ladies Guild Anniversary in March

Reflections – from March 1991, Pauline Jorgenson

On March 23, 1923, a group of five ladies met a Pastor Bast's pardonage at 4350 Harriet Avenue for the purpose of orgainzing a Guild. A constitution was adopted in April. The Guild firs met in homes until the group becae larger, Then they met at the church at 39th and Grand

The 20's and 30's were hard years. It was difficult to meet church expenses and pay the Pastor's salary. The women helped by having many bake sales, rummage sales, bazaars and dinners. The women did take time for socializing. In 1933 a celebration of the 10th anniversary of the Guild was held at Mrs. Bjork's Trio Eat Shop. The cost of the luncheon was 35 cents.

Guild Reflections con't:

Plans were started for a new church at 39th and First Avenue. The women contributed over \$2000 toward the purchase of lots. The Guild bought seven dozen dinner plates, salad plates, cups and seven dozen sets of silverware for their future kitchen. In March of 1940, prior to the completion of the new church plans the congregation suffered the loss of Pastor Paul Bast. (Another blow was endured in March 1945, when his son Paul was killed in Service.)

Under the guidance of Pastor Roman Palmer, the New Pilgrim was built and dedicated in February 1942. During the following years, whenever the Guild had a limited amount in the treasury, it would vote to make a unit payment of the church debt in the amount of \$443.10. The total extra mortgage payments made by the Guild was in the amount of \$11,691.30. They also paid \$1000 toward the gallery window (Incidentally, the beautiful memorial windows and name plates cost only \$61.25).

Church dinners became an annual event. In 1942, the Guild served a chicken dinner charging 60 cents for adults and 35 cents for children. By the mid-50's bountiful smorgasbords were the rage and a suggested free will offering of \$1.00 for adult and 50 cents for children.

Catering for weddings has been a featured service of the Guild. (In 1969 thirteen weddings were served, two in one day.) Among the purchases for the church were kitchen equipment, dining room tables, and folding chairs. Monies from the Make & Bake Sales have been designated for Home and Foreign Missions.

For these 67 years, the object of this Society continued to be "to further Christian fellowship among the women of Pilgrim Lutheran Church, to assist in the work of our church and other worthy causes".

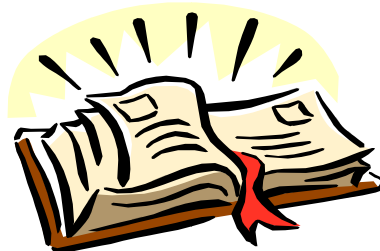

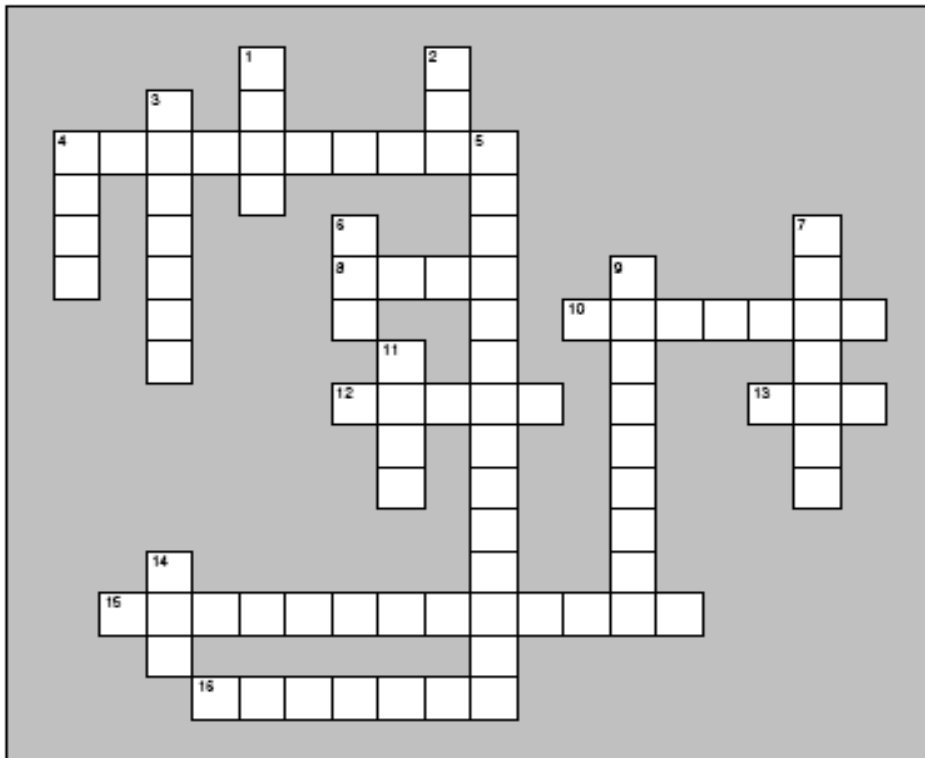
