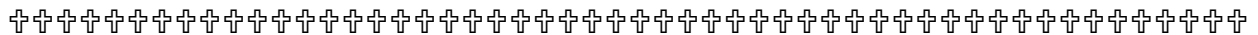

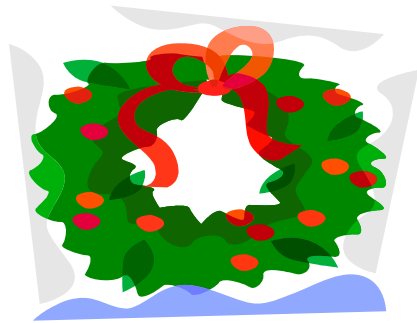
The Girl Pioneers will meet first and third wed of each month except for December

We are taking orders **until November 18th** and **pickup** date is **November 25th** between services or other arrangements can be made.

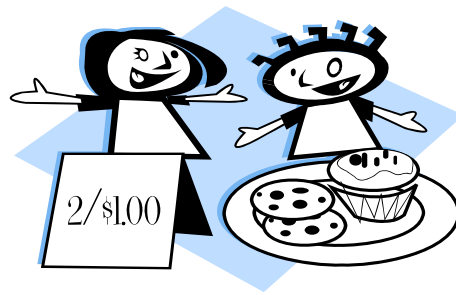

Attention Blood Donors !!!

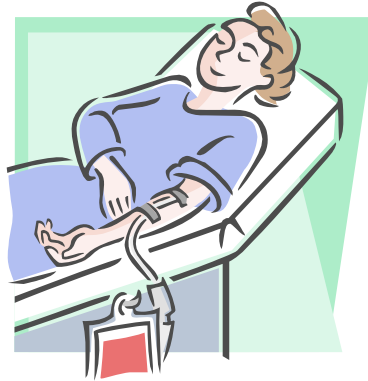
September 8, 2007 is the last day you can donate blood if you are planning to donate for the Pilgrim Blood Drive on November 3, 2007.

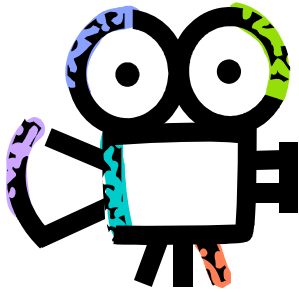

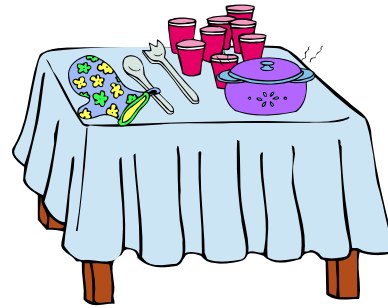
The Pot Luck was a Great Success

Many, many thanks to all who contributed and helped with the setup and cleanup.

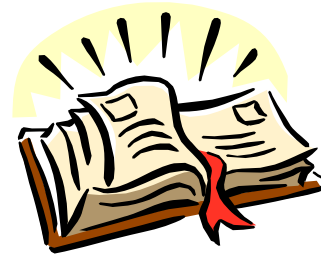

A Ministry in Music

My name is Chris Driesbach. Chris will perform at Pilgrim November 24 at 7:00 PM. Invite your friends! Here is some back ground information.

I'm the musician at Crown of Life WELS in New Orleans, and during the last 15 months I've been on many "Thank You" trips, playing concerts at over 160 churches in 27 states from Seattle Washington to Tucson AZ to Eagle River WI to Atlanta GA. There is no charge for my performances and my cds are free. I gratefully accept lodging with a church member if offered. My concerts last about an hour and ten minutes and feature a Powerpoint presentation of the story of Katrina and the rebuilding of our church. My songs are all original Christian music and I tell the story of our church and my own journey to faith.

Crown of Life was almost destroyed August 29, 2005 when flooding caused by hurricane Katrina put 4.5 feet of water in our 3 church buildings. I was one of the first to get into our property after the water went down and I have to say I really thought we were finished as a congregation. I was so wrong! God's love has poured over our us through the overwhelming kindness of individuals, churches, and the synod. The Builders for Christ have restored our church, fellowship hall and parsonage. Our church was rededicated October 29, 2006. 16 of our members' homes have been rebuilt by the Kingdom Workers Faith in Action group. Many students came here to do the dirty, dangerous work of gutting flooded homes. Ample funds have been generously donated to pay for it all. I wish I could tell you what it's like for us to have been recipients of all this care and love. Completely amazing, awesome, and impossible to comprehend.

I moved to New Orleans in October of 2000, and have been a member of Crown of Life since then and the church musician for most of that time. I've been writing Christian songs for the last 3 years, including a song about my personal experience with hurricane Katrina. I have recorded 2 Christian CDs; "After the Storm" in August 2006 and "Movin' On" late June 2007.

I played music professionally for 30 years on the west coast. I was an atheist until age 33, and after that sort of a new-age spiritualist. 8 years later I became a WELS Lutheran and a Christian at the same time in 1995. Faith Lutheran Church and Pastor James Oldfield in Anchorage Alaska were my first church and pastor. I was given the gift of faith by the spirit working though God's Word. Pastor Oldfield read to me out of the bible when I asked him all the questions I could think of. We went through a 22-week bible study course together, and my life completely changed, of course!

I lost all my musical equipment in the flood following the storm, but generous WELS members have given money to replace it, and I've got some really wonderful new gear. I have a deep desire to go play for and say thanks to the nice people who've helped us so much, and have touched me so wonderfully, to meet them and worship with them. I've long dreamed of a career as a Christian songwriter and performer and my prayer is that this will be a beginning of a new job working for my God.
